Bidding Methods:- 5-card majors, 14-17 NT

Style of leads, signals, Standard leads
discards:- Reverse signals & discards (mostly attitude)

ASPECTS OF SYSTEM WHICH OPONENTS SHOULD NOTE

1C can be 2 cards; TRANSFER RESPONSES

2D is 9-13, diamonds or minors

Many transfers in competition

STRENGTH OF 1NT OPENERS: 14-16 (17 if 4333)

2♣ RESPONSE TO 1NT OPENER IS: 5-card puppet Stayman

Both players of a partnership must have identically completed convention cards.
Cards must be exchanged with opponents for each round.
